What is Public Health?



"The practice of preventing disease and promoting good health in groups of people, from small communities to entire countries."

What does it mean to "prevent disease?"



It means we...

- Stop health problems from ever starting
- Catch health problems early so they don't get worse
- Manage health problems so they don't cause death or disability

What does it mean to "promote health in groups?"



It means we...


 Lead and support actions that help individuals, groups, and communities be healthy

What is a community?

It's a group of people that have something in common...

Commonalities	Example
Geographic boundaries	Live in same neighborhood
Sense of membership	Belong to the same parent group or church
Culture and language	Speak the same language
Common norms, interests, or values	Like the same sports team
Common health risks or conditions	Have asthma
Live or work in the same place	Work for LA County
Social, economic, and physical risk factors where they live or work	Live or work near freeways

How does Public Health work with communities?




Changes in policies, laws, organizations, and power structures that influence health broadly.

Changes in collective community norms, attitudes, awareness, practices, and behaviors that influence the health of specific groups.

Changes in individual knowledge, attitudes, beliefs, practices, and behaviors that influence health.

EXAMPLE: Three Levels Example



Support law requiring all entering kindergarteners to have certain immunizations

Collect data on outbreaks, monitor immunization trends, work with schools, clinics and health care providers to promote immunizations

Nurses give shots to children and educate parents

How is public health different from clinical care?

Public health focuses on prevention not treatment.

Public health works with communities not just individuals.

Public health only works at a community-level.

Public Health's Top Accomplishments during the 20th Century


Today, Americans live about <u>30 years longer</u> than in the year 1900 mostly due to Public Health efforts



- Developing immunizations
- 2. Ensuring safer workplaces
- 3. Controlling infectious diseases
- 4. Decreasing deaths from heart disease/stroke
- 5. Ensuring safer and healthier foods
- Increasing family planning options
- 7. Adding fluoride to drinking water
- 8. Supporting measures to reduce tobacco use
- 9. Developing motor-vehicle safety policies
- 10. Improving health for mothers and babies

Assessment

- Track births and deaths
- Track prescriptions
- Conduct disease surveillance 24 hours a day seven days a week
- Provide services at our public health lab
- Investigate disease outbreaks
- Let people know if they've come into contact with a disease
- Let the public know about product recalls



Assessment continued

- Check ocean water and swimming pools to make sure swim areas are safe
- Test animals and insects known to cause disease like birds, mosquitos, and squirrels



Policy Development

- Inform people at public events and presentations
- Make home visits to young moms
- Share public health messages through media campaigns



Policy Development continued

- Write and practice plans with cities, businesses, and schools to prepare for disasters and terrorism
- Work with partners to advocate for healthy communities that are safe and have bike lanes, farmers markets, and smoke-free public areas
- Bring groups together that care about the same issues




- Inspect and grade restaurants, markets, and food trucks to prevent food-related illness
- Inspect and license hospitals and nursing homes
- Inspect homes to prevent lead poisoning and other dangers
- Control animals, rodents, and insects that may cause disease



Assurance continued

- Give free or low cost vaccinations
- Provide medical care for people that have sexually transmitted diseases, or tuberculosis
- Provide substance abuse prevention, treatment, and recovery services
- Coordinate free health care for people that have HIV/AIDS
- Help coordinate health services for children in foster care and probation



Assurance continued

- Help agencies learn how to enroll people into health insurance programs
- Refer people to other agencies for health services DPH doesn't provide
- Train DPH staff to respond to terrorism threats, emerging infections, and natural disasters
- Write reports that show our activities and progress

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FOR EVERYONE

Wearing a mask keeps us from catching or spreading germs. Keeping everyone healthy during flu season means...

- Our team gets a flu shot or wears a mask
- You ask us for a mask if you feel sick, like when you have a fever, chills, cough, sore throat, body aches, runny or stuffy nose

WE HELP EACH OTHER STAY HEALTHY!

DPH keeps hens at different places to track disease. Staff tests the hens' blood every two weeks to see if they've gotten a disease that spreads by mosquito bites. This is an example of...



Departmental accomplishments

Examples of how DPH helps improve health in LA County

We work with other County departments, elected officials, schools, businesses, and other partners to...

- Advocate for calories to be posted on menus
- Write bicycle master plans that have led to 800 miles of new bikeways
- Create smoke-free beaches, restaurants, and parks
- Respond to countywide emergencies like pandemic H1N1 flu and radiation after the Fukishima Daiichi nuclear disaster
- Hold makers of lead paint legally responsible for creating unhealthy environments, especially for infants and children

Examples of how DPH helps improve health in LA County

Carry out programs that have helped decrease the...

- Percent of kids who drank one or more sugary drinks from 43.3% in 2007 to 38.3% in 2011
- Number of adult smokers in LA County below one million for the first time since 1997
- LA County death rate by 19% during 2001-2010
