#### Safety Message: Distracted Driving

California's 'no-touch' phone law is expected to become more strictly enforced after a recent Court of Appeal's ruling determined that holding or touching a phone for any reason, not just texting or phone calls, is a violation of the law. This includes the use of a phone while at a stoplight or stop sign.

Distracted driving is one of the leading causes of accidents on the roadways. If you have employees that drive company vehicles, it is vitally important to ensure that drivers are using safe practices to reduce accidents. Below are general good practices to follow:

- Turn phone on 'do not disturb' mode while driving
- Use voice commands and built-in connectivity
- Set up map and select music before beginning to drive
- Pull over the vehicle in a safe location to use phone
